The National Fire Fighter Near-Miss Reporting System created a group of national trainers to help raise the level of awareness for the program.

- The National Fire Fighter Near-Miss Trainers (near-miss trainers) will help to improve firefighter safety by making the fire service community aware of the National Fire Fighter Near-Miss Reporting System. Their primary responsibility is to educate departments, organizations, and/or associations on the value of near-miss reporting.
- A near-miss trainer will come to your department, organization or association and provide you with this valuable information. The program trainers cover all ten FEMA regions around the country.

- Go to www.firefighternearmiss.com, select “Resources”, select “Near-Miss Trainers” download the presentations and customize them to your own department rather than using a near-miss trainer.
